Killers Bay luxury apartments are set in one of the most stunning surfing locations in the world. Situated on the peeling right and left reef break of la Source, the waves are so close you can almost touch them. Surf Maroc have 9 beautiful, chic, newly built luxury apartments available.

Each apartment is individually appointed in contemporary Moroccan style and are finished to the highest standard. All of the accommodation have private balconies or patios which look out across the landscaped gardens, pool area and onto the breathtaking set up of 4 of the best surf breaks in this part of the world. Every apartment has a large comfortable living room with tv and satellite system.

The open plan kitchen has a fridge, cooking hobs, oven. The bathrooms have a tiled finish throughout and bathroom towels are supplied.

Eight of the apartments have one double bedroom and a twin. There is one de-luxe apartment which is larger and has three bedrooms.

The hire car, which is included in the price of a stay, enables guests to easily access Taghazout or Agadir, to go shopping or eat at restaurants as well as visit the many cities and attractions Morocco has to offer.

frequently asked questions

HOW DO I GET THERE?

Morocco is served by direct flights from the UK and other major European hubs, with flight times to Agadir between 2-4 hours. Guests traveling from the US can connect either in Casablanca or at a European hub as there are no direct flights to Agadir. From Agadir airport it's a 45 minute drive south east along the coast road. Road transfers from Marrakech to can be easily arranged and take 4 - 5 hours and cost approx. £80 for 4 people. Please contact us if you would like us to arrange a transfer or would like a quote.

DO I NEED A VISA?

EU passport holders with a passport that is valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date do not require a visa to enter Morocco for tourist purposes. If you hold a passport from outside the European Union we strongly recommend that you check with your nearest Moroccan Embassy.

CAN I BRING MY CHILDREN?

Children of all ages are very welcome, but we do not have specialised child care facilities.

CAN I USE MY PHONE? IS THERE INTERNET?

Nearly all European networks work in Morocco. Contact your network for call charges. Coverage is good. There are an abundance of public phones, coin and cards, in Taghazout. International call charges are relatively cheap. There is free w.i. fi available at the L'Auberge, Taghazout Villa and Villa Mandala. There are also broadband internet cafés in Taghazout.

WHAT IS THE SURF AND THE WEATHER LIKE? WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO VISIT?

Morocco is a year round destination for great surf and great weather and Surf Maroc is open all year.

The summer months (April - October) see small to medium swells with surfing mostly taking place on the beaches and reefs on the more exposed north west coast, this is great time for anyone looking for fun, uncrowded warm water surf. During the winter months the waves that have made Morocco famous come to life. The variety of surf in this area of Morocco is huge. There are not many places like it. The region has something for everyone, from ideal beginner waves to challenging reef ledges. Intermediates and those new to the sport should not be put off or worried. Due to the nature of the coastline there is almost always somewhere sheltered and manageable, and those looking for something challenging won't be disappointed. Morocco is blessed with 300 days of sunshine a year. Between the months November to February it is possible it can rain.

WHAT ELSE IS THERE TO DO APART FROM SURF?

Taghazout and the surrounding area offer a whole range of other activities. If you feel like a break from surfing or for anyone who doesn't surf then horse and camel riding, trekking and quad biking are all close by and easily organized. For those who just want to relax there are miles of empty golden sandy beaches to discover or you can sunbathe and chill out in the privacy of the villa or your apartment. The Souq's of Agadir provide the essential Moroccan shopping experience. Two day trips to the ancient city of Marrakech can be organized. The beautiful seaside town of Essaouira is only two and half hours to the north and is a popular one or two day trip. There is a great market (Souq) in Agadir which has all the stuff you would expect in Morocco, an abundance of leather goods, woodwork, ceramics, rugs, carpets and clothing are all on offer. Non threatening haggling is part of the fun.

There is also a small market in the town square of Taghazout that sells local wares.

WHAT IS IT LIKE TO DRIVE IN MOROCCO?

We provide airport transfers to and from Agadir airport. From then on you have a hire car at your disposal for the rest of your stay. Please ensure you have the original of a valid EU driving license which must have been held for at least one year. The law insists that you always carry your driving license and car hire documents with you when driving in Morocco. Seat belts must be worn at all times and you must not use your mobile whilst driving (a fining offense). Police and Gendarmerie checkpoints every few kilometers along the routes are standard. Minor infringements will result in your having to make an on the spot payment. All our hire cars are insured with a €500 excess. We have limited amount of roof straps in peak season so please bring your own if you have them. Minimum age for hiring a car from us is 21. The nearest petrol station is in Banana Village five minutes south of Taghazout.

In Morocco, as on Continental Europe driving is on the right. The main roads around Taghazout are good. In addition, when driving in Morocco, we advise you to drive slowly and carefully as the roads are generally narrower and may sometimes have bumps and potholes, especially after periods of rain. We do ask that you take particular care when driving, bearing in mind the conditions of your hire car rental agreement. Please bring roof straps if you have them.

WHAT IS IN THE APARTMENT?

All bed linen is provided in all standard of apartment. All have TV's. Killers Bay Bath towels only are available, these are not to be used at the beach. There are no washing machines at any of our apartments or internet.

CAN I SPEND CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR AT SURF MAROC?

Absolutely! Spend Christmas or New Year on the beach in the sun and surf some great waves. Each year we throw Christmas and New years party at one of the venues with all our guests invited. New year is fancy dress. 09/10 theme is Tropicana.

HOW ABOUT CASH? WHAT IS THE CURRENCY? WHERE CAN I GET IT?

The Moroccan currency is the Dirham. Exchange rates at last time of checking were around 12.5 dh to the £1, 11 dh to the € and 7.6 to the \$. Dirhams can only be obtained within Morocco. There are exchange facilities in the airport as well as ATMs. There are also a number of ATMs in Agadir. There are no ATM's in Taghazout the nearest is Aourir a five minute drive from Taghazout. This machine and many others in Morocco do not accept Maestro, if you have a VISA bring that.

Please note: traveler's cheques are not the best option for Morocco they cannot be exchanged at the airport or in Taghazout and only in few places in Agadir.

WHAT VOLTAGE AND PLUGS DO YOU USE?

Morocco is on 220 volts with two-pin round plugs.

WHEN CAN I ARRIVE?

You can get to us any time. It is not always possible to have your apartment ready until after 2pm. If you do want to arrive early and your apartment isn't ready, start enjoying yourself anyway – we'll take care of your bags and get you started on what ever service you have chosen. Check out of rooms is officially 10pm, but if you would like a late check out, let us know and we'll do our best.

MEDICAL INFORMATION

No vaccinations are required for visitors to Morocco and anti-malarial precautions are not necessary. We have first aid equipment along with staff trained in administering first aid. In case of an emergency, there are hospitals and clinics in Agadir. Medical charges will apply according to treatment so make sure you have travel insurance before you go. There is a well stocked pharmacy in Taghazout which is open everyday.

WHAT BOARDS SHOULD I BRING, DO YOU RENT EQUIPMENT?

With such a large range and choice of waves you may want to bring a whole quiver of boards. To generalise, the majority of waves are right hand point breaks from soft, slow, rolling spots to heavy, fast barreling spots. Bring equipment to suit your ability and what you want to surf. If you don't want to go big, your everyday board will suffice, there's nearly always somewhere sheltered. If you do want to charge the big stuff, bring something suitable as mid-winter waves can get up to 15ft.

We have stocked our beach front base in Taghazout with over 40 of SurfTech's latest models from their extensive range; Alongside that FCS have supplied their cutting edge fins system, it's a perfect opportunity to experiment with new shapes and fins or use the identical boards you have at home without the hassle and burden of transporting it.

We also have a fully kited out surf school with every shape and size of board to get you standing up and surfing.

Bring spare leashes, reef boots if you have delicate feet, spare fin keys, spare fins.

WHAT AMENITIES ARE THERE IN TAGHAZOUT, TIGGERS COVE & KILLERS BAY?

Taghazout has an abundance of restaurants and cafes in Taghazout, including our own Auberge restaurant on the sea front. There are plenty of grocery shops selling fruit vegetable and other essentials. There is a well stocked pharmacy and four surf shops (see below). There are also lots of internet cafes with ADSL connection. Alcohol can be bought in Agadir. Killers Bay is a five minute drive from Taghazout and twenty minute walk. There are no shops or restaurants at Killers Bay.

ARE THERE SURF SHOPS IN TAGHAZOUT, WHAT CAN I BUY THERE?

There are a few surf shops in Taghazout. They now stock a fair bit of hardware leashes, wax, deckgrip etc. The surf board and clothing selection is growing also. Most of the shops offer board repairs they are often great value and of good quality.

WHAT ABOUT CLOTHING, WHAT WILL I NEED?

Morocco is a liberal Muslim country, and men and women are welcome to wear shorts, t-shirts and Swimming costumes and bikinis are normal on the beach but it is advisable to cover up arms and legs a bit when walking around town. Shorts and tees and flip flops are the norm. Trousers and jumpers are sometimes needed particularly in mid winter when the evenings can be chilly so warm clothes are a good idea during that period.

WHAT FOOD CAN I EXPECT?

There are abundance of restaurants and cafes in Taghazout, including our Auberge on the sea front. All serve a great mix of Moroccan and western food and are open for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

WHAT ABOUT ALCOHOLIC DRINKS?

Although Islam forbids the consumption of alcohol by Muslims, alcoholic drinks can be legally served and sold throughout the country, though you won't find it on the menu in Taghazout. Morocco even produces its own range of wines and beers. Alcohol is not sold in Taghazout but can be bought in Agadir, guest frequently let us arrange taxi's to take them to Agadir to buy alcohol. Please feel free to bring alcohol from duty free to any of our venues.
